

Sincere thanks to those who contributed to help MMTA bestow this honor to Carol for all her many hours and years of work for the association. She will be recognized at the MTNA Foundation Gala in Toronto on March 27 in the Grand Ballroom of the Sheraton. Carol will be honored at the Gala, in print and in the presentations, as well as on the MTNA web site.

Many who contributed to Carol's Fellow Fund sent notes expressing their delight. Mildred Dickson writes, "I don't know of anyone more deserving of this recognition. She has worked tirelessly over the years for the local, state, and national organizations – all the while continuing to improve her skills so she would have more to offer her own students."

Carol now knows about this honor, and is thinking about whether or not she might make an attempt to attend. She is humbled and honored, and wants to go, but Toronto is a big trip and her husband has just had hip surgery. She has NOT ruled out going yet!! With tremendous help from Pat Tuley, I share below a brief summary Carol's MMTA history.

Carol Schutzmann has been a member of the Gulf Coast Music Teachers Association, the Mississippi Music Teachers Association and Music Teachers National Association since 1982. She obtained MTNA Professional Certification in piano in 1988. Her Nationally Certified Teacher of Music designation was earned by examination since her Bachelor of Arts degree from Loyola University in New Orleans was in English. Continued professional development has been evident from the many workshops, seminars and conferences Carol has attended. Carol has operated an independent piano teaching studio in Long Beach on the Mississippi Gulf Coast for twenty-seven years, and continues to teach. During this time her professional contributions to local, state and national associations have been many. Various offices she has held include those of GCMTA and MMTA President and Pre-College Auditions Chair. Significant among her accomplishments during her 1998-2000 term as MMTA President was securing the IRS 501(c) (3) status for the association. Her fellow teachers on the Gulf Coast recall all the sleepless nights Carol spent scheduling the pre-college auditions. It was such a complicated job that only she could do it! She has held concurrently the Composition Competitions Chair for MMTA and Southern Division MTNA for four terms. Carol has served often as an adjudicator, has attended numerous MMTA and MTNA Conferences, and was a presenter at the 1990 MTNA National Conference. A little bit of trivia about Carol tells us a lot about her life; her e-mail address moniker is "PianoMom7." This reveals to all who know her that she is a piano teacher and that she and her husband of 47 years, Roy, are the parents of seven children and grandparents of twelve grandchildren, all of whom she says are above average, and either beautiful or handsome! Carol Schutzmann has been a very busy lady, leading a successful personal and family life while being a consummate music teaching professional! "Musicians for Mississippi"

A love story

Approximately one year ago Kathy Edwards and her family traveled to Mississippi during the holidays to help with the post-Katrina clean-up. Upon returning home Kathy knew she could not let that be the end of their assistance. As the president of the Nashville Area Music Teachers Association she believed there was more they could do to help the teachers in South Mississippi. She brought her ideas to NAMTA, a committee was formed, and in time the "Musicians for Mississippi Concert" fund-raiser became a reality. The concert was held on Saturday, October 21, 2006, in Nashville. Additionally, the committee decided to host a state-wide Practice-A-Thon during the

month of October. Music students throughout Tennessee practiced to raise more ey to help us in Mississippi.

It was my privilege to be invited to Nashville to accept the proceeds of the two fund-raisers.

I arrived at the Nashville airport about 11:00 a.m. Friday morning. Kathy had told me that she would wear red. What she actually did was hold a sign reading "Hello, Carol." I felt like a celebrity — and was treated like one the entire time I was there. The Tennessee MTA had a board meeting scheduled that night at a restaurant in Murfreesboro. Kathy invited are to join them. The next day was a workshop/master class given by Steven Hesla, professor at the University of Montana Missoula. When the workshop/master class was over, Kathy began making presentations. Trophies were presented to the two students who raised the most money in the Practice-A-Thon: one was an adult male, the other nine year old girl. I regret that I did not get their names (yet). The little girl had raised over \$300! Dr. Hesla asked her to play one of the pieces she had practiced, and she obliged.

Then Kathy called me up to the platform. By this time, I suspected that perhaps they had raised a few thousand dollars from both events. There was no way I could have anticipated the actual amount. Not only did they present me with a 'large' check for \$8500 (approximately), but they also presented me with the papers for a Boston upright piano to be given to one of our teachers! Bill Metcalfe, owner of the Steinway Piano Gallery in Nashville, matched the funds raised from the concert to make this possible. Since I couldn't carry the piano home, Kathy gave me a glass piano filled with M&M's which have printed on them "M 4 M". I was very close to being speechless, but not entirely. Yes, I was in tears, and it was several moments before I could begin to say 'thank you.'

That night Kathy, her husband David and I were invited to be Bill Metcalfe's guests at a cocktain party/dinner dance called "An Evening of Swing" at Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro. The next morning — although I was already in the clouds — Kathy drove me to the airport for the return home.

As I write this I feel that it all just happened this weekend. The generosity, caring and love that was an integral part of the two events and my weekend there will never be forgotten. Thank you to the Nashville Area MTA, the teachers and students who took part in the events, Bill Metcalfe and the Steinway Piano Gallery, and especially to Kathy Edwards who worked so long and tirelessly to make the events an overwhelming success!

As most of you know, we've had a "changing of the guard" in some of our offices in MMTA. Please allow me to introduce myself. I am Beth Parker, a private piano teacher and music educator from Laurel, and affiliated with the Jones County Music Teachers Association. I am also the Choral Director at the Laurel Christian High School for the Jr. High and High School Choirs. My husband Ronnie and I served as music missionaries to Brazil for over 20 years and only returned to the US five years ago.

At the MMTA convention in November, the huge job that Jacquelyn Thornell so diligently managed in recent years was divided into two positions. Janet Gray is the newly elected *Vice President for Pre-College Performance* and I am handling the *Pre-College Auditions*. It is my responsibility to prepare and distribute testing materials for the auditions. Once the testing is over and the results are compiled, Janet will assume the SSRR and all that it entails.

MMTA Pre-College Local Auditions for 2007 are just around the corner as you well know. Testing dates are March 24 for Columbus/Starkville, Ellisville, Gulf Coast, Oxford, Vicksburg, and Wesson and March 31 for Cleveland, Jackson, Hattiesburg, Meridian and Tupelo. The new testing materials should be in the hands of the chairs for each audition center by early March. As this article is being written, the new theory tests are being proof-read for errors and level-appropriateness. Your input is valuable, so when grading the tests this year, please note any typo errors or other problems. Share them with your audition chair who can contact me with the specifics.

Just in case you are unaware, the "Piano Requirements", the "Written Theory Requirements", the "Auditions Application Form", and the "Local Auditions and SSRR Guidelines" were updated (before I took office) to read "Fall 2006". Look at the bottom of your Syllabus pages. If your print-outs say "Pre-College Syllabus Revisions – Spring 2006" they are already outdated. The new ones read "Pre-College Syllabus Revisions – Fall 2006". (I did notice that the application procedures and the three adjudication forms still read "Spring 2006".) Go to the MMTA website and click on Pre-College Auditions or use the following link: (www.msmusicteachers.org/competitions-precollege-auditions.php). On the Pre-College page, you should download every file under the heading PIANO to use in your application process and preparation of your student for the auditions. Please read the updated guidelines to clarify any doubts you might have about the local auditions as well as SSRR. These are all PDF files and Adobe Acrobat Reader is required to open them.

As you prepare yourselves with the new revisions, and your students with the technique and theory requirements, the audition chairs in eleven centers all over the state are busy handling the logistics of running the auditions. This is a cumbersome task; there are many details to handle. Please remember to thank them for their hard work.

As I begin my new term of office, I'm excited about working with the Theory aspect of the auditions. I have taught Music Theory both at the college and seminary level and it is a passion of mine. It is my philosophy that a solid foundation in music theory makes a good musician. Let me take this opportunity to thank three of my colleagues in the JCMTA for their help: Janine Beasley, for allowing me to bounce ideas around with her, and for assisting me with some of the tests; Ellen Gunn and Martha Tisdale for proof-reading the new tests.





Program Notes

One of the places I have always wanted to travel is to Ireland. The books of photographs and the travelogues which one occasionally sees on television bespeak of a country rich in wonderful scenery and tradition and a people of warmth and grace. When approached about the possibility of doing this year's MMTA commissioned work, I had already agreed to write a work for my good friend Sybil Cheesman. *Irish Sketches* is the result of this confluence of events. The initial ideas came from photos of specific places which attracted my attention.

Mrs. Cheesman wanted to feature two different flutes in this work, the regular C flute and the alto flute pitched in G. The second and fourth movements, both of which are slow, feature the alto flute. The images conjured up in the titles are purely of my own making—the photo of the light house looked as though there might be some ghostly presence knocking around in its cold interior and the River Shannon image seemed very peaceful with occasional outbursts by the local bird population. The music attempts to paint pictures.

One of the joys of writing something like this is to do it for my friends. I cannot imagine the work being in any better hands than those of Sybil and Angela. Their solid musicianship is always a joy to behold. I hope you will enjoy the music



and am very grateful for the opportunity to represent the state of Mississippi as the Commissioned Composer for 2006.




From the **MMT** Editor
