

Message from the President Rachel Heard

To: Members of the MMTA Executive Committee May 22, 2010





During the State President's Advisory Council Meeting, reports were given by the top leaders in MTNA. President Ann Gipson noted that the attendance for the national conference was down possibly due to the downturn in the economy. She also encouraged members to recruit at the grassroots level and to invite student members and other young professionals to become involved in leadership roles. Treasurer Cheryl Pachak-Brooks ensured all members present that MTNA is in good financial health, much improved over the previous year. As of February 28, 2010, MTNA's current assets were \$2,527,468, a net gain of over \$554,000; and short-term cash was \$363,358, a net gain of over \$100,000 since February 2009. Executive Director, Gary Ingle, presented an update on the Leadership Summit which had been cancelled last fall due to the economy. Instead of holding the Summit in early September at the beginning of our teaching year, this year's Summit will be held during the March national conference. This will expand the national conference and also allow the Summit to invite not only state presidents, but other state and local leaders.

As MMTA president, it is always an honor to present awards during our 2010 State Finals Recitals held this spring in Hattiesburg at William Carey University. The success of this event is in large part due to the tireless efforts of Ellen Price Elder, VP-Performance and this year's host. Her organizational skills and ability to maintain calm as so many little ones were forced to be both inside and out due to inclement off and on rainy weather were once again truly admirable. From my vantage point, everything seemed to run smoothly. Again, I thank you for allowing me to serve our organization.

New MTNA Certification Guidelines

The new MTNA Certification process is now available for piano, voice, violin and flute teachers.

Certification candidates are now required to complete these projects: explanation of teaching philosophy, analysis of teaching pieces, video of teaching, description of teaching environment, discussion of business ethics and studio policies. Teacher Profile Project workbooks for each instrument are available on the MTNA Certification website. The workbooks are accompanied by a document titled, "What Will The Evaluators Be Looking For?" which guides candidates as they complete the profile projects. Other materials, including articles about video recording lessons, can also be found on the Certification website.

"Pre-College Evaluations," previously known as "Pre-College Auditions," were held at 10 District locations on March 27, and April 10, with 450 students registered, and 410 participating. Of these students, 269 participated in all areas of evaluation, called "Basics." After expenses for judges' fees, meals, and printing, the net income was \$6840, which is used for expenses related to State Finals.

Evaluation 2011 will be held on the first two Saturdays of April, as prescribed in the Syllabus. District Chairs should arrange for their site as soon as possible. When Group A and Group B comply with the schedule, alternate locations are convenient for students with conflicts.

"Thank you!" to District Chairs who have expended time and energy preparing for, and administering the Evaluations. Beginning with reserving the evaluations site and engaging judges, and ending with completing multiple reports, their can be an exhausting job. Colleagues, we appreciate the service you provide for MMTA and for our pre-college students.







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2010 MMTA Pre-College Performance Report by Ellen Price Elder

On Saturday, May 1, 2010, the MMTA Pre-College Finals were held at William Carey University in Hattiesburg. There were 302 eligible student entrants, with 245 students participating on that day. The William Carey University Music Department very graciously provided a hospitality room throughout the day for teachers, students, and guests. William Carey University student workers were also there to monitor practice rooms, and to assist wherever needed.

Lunch was catered by McAllister's Deli and teachers paid \$6.50 for a sandwich bar. Twenty-three lunches were sold for a total of \$149.50.

There were eleven judges this year. The judges were cooperative and every recital produced winners and numerous ribbon recipients. Approximately thirty teachers assisted with the recitals and in the workroom. Drs. Rachel Heard and Ian Hominick ably represented our organization through the presentation of awards, and Dr. Darwin Brooks took pictures for the *MMT*, with Melinda Porter serving as assistant.

There were six Eight-Year Achievement Award Winners and 219 High Composite Score certificates. This was the second year that teachers and students were asked to pay three dollars for program booklets, in order to offset the cost of printing. We made \$552.00 profit on these booklets.

The event was successful. I am deeply grateful to the teachers who assisted on that day. The MMTA Pre-College Finals are scheduled for Saturday, May 7, 2011, location TBA. District auditions will be scheduled during the Executive Board Meeting in May. This information will be available on the msmusicteachers.org website.

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
