The 2017 MMTA Pre-College Finals event was held on Saturday, May 13, at the University of Southern Mississippi (USM) in Hattiesburg. Seven 8-year Outstanding Achievement Awards (OAA) were given and 216 High Composite Score certificates were awarded with ties for the highest scores in Levels 3 and 7. A total of twenty-three plaques were awarded: sixteen for the highest composite scores and seven for the OAA winners. Ten judges worked during the day: eight piano judges, one voice judge, and one strings judge. One of our MMTA members, Dr. Ian Hominick, served as a piano judge because one of the original judges was absent due to an emergency. All recitals on the day ended by 3:20pm. 

Vicksburg Music Teachers League



Victoria Gong, piano student of Judith Allen, won the NTMA State Advanced division with a 20-minute program. She went to the Regional Competition in South Carolina and played beautifully, but did not place. At the MMTA State Finals in Hattiesburg this Spring, Victoria won first place in the Level 10 piano solo, and third place in piano sonata. Jeanne Evans had vocal students compete in the MMTA State Finals in Hattiesburg. In Level 12, her students swept First, Second, and Third places: Gabrielle Green in first place, Evan Cochran in second, and Vera Ann Fedell in third place. Music Forum of Jackson continued this year's events with holding our Forty-Eighth Bach Festival on February 4 at Hinds Community College in Raymond, again chaired by Kathie Gunn Lott. Of 377 pre-college students who registered, 322 participated. We presented twenty-two 5-year Superior medals, one 9-year Superior trophy, and new this year, three Senior Awards for Superiors beyond 9. Watch for the mailing of the 2018 brochure!

Music Forum of Jackson members' students who receive their 5-Year Superior Bach Festival medal are offered a minimum \$100 scholarship to attend a Music Camp in Mississippi, with any balance in our allotted amount being divided by those who accept. This year we had 15 eligible, with 2 accepting, which allowed us to give fully-paid scholarships to them.

As president, I was privileged to represent Music Forum of Jackson at the MTNA Conference in Baltimore in March. I was delighted to witness our long-time member Sandra Polanski honored as a MTNA Fellow in absentia, with the award received on her behalf by Alice Ballard.

Nineteen of our members entered a total of 115 participating students in our local MMTA Auditions held at Hinds Community College on April 8; we had 7 highly qualified and experienced judges, and 19 faithful workers to carry out the event, chaired by Jacquelyn Thornell. A number of these qualified to participate in the State Finals in Hattieburg.

We ended our year on May 12 with a luncheon at Anjou Restaurant. Officers for 2017-2018 were elected; the slate was unchanged from this year. Plans for the new year are already underway with a Budget Committee scheduled for June 13, and subsequent Board meeting. We look forward to celebrating our 50th anniversary as a local affiliate during 2018. Our chairman for this is Patsy Simpson.

Gulf Coast Music Teachers Association

GCMTA's Music Festival was held on February 18, 2017, at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College's Jeff Davis Campus in Gulfport. A total of 70 piano, strings, and vocal performances were turned in by 66 students from the studios of 11 teachers. Scoring High Superior were 42 of the performances. Six students, who have performed in the Festival Honors Recitals for at least 5 consecutive years, were presented with Five-Year Awards of \$25 each. We were delighted that Dr. Lois Leventhal and her husband Dr. David Evenson were willing to return to the Coast from Boston, Massachusetts to judge for our event! They were joined by Dr. Debra Atkinson, head of Choral Activities at MGCCC-JD.

Our local MMTA Pre-college Evaluations took place on April 1, at MGCCC-JD. Participating were 24 piano and strings students representing five teachers, and turning in a total of 34 performances. Qualifying for State Finals were 26 performances of 16 students representing three teachers. Fourteen students took 24 performances to Finals. Dividing up judging duties for our Local Evaluations were Rigoberto Murillo, violin instructor from the Dallas, Texas area, and Guy Bowering, who is a teacher and accompanist on the Gulf Coast. Carol Mahler and Bonnie Sheldon co-chaired our Local Evaluations.

This year, three high school seniors competed in GCMTA's **Senior Awards Recital**, which took place at Fleming Auditorium at USM-Gulf Park Campus in Long Beach on Sunday afternoon, April 30. Vice-president Elsie Barnes organized the event. A total of \$850 in scholarship money was awarded to two students who tied for First Place and an Honorable Mention winner. Adjudicating for the event was Dr. Kadisha Onalbayeva, Steinway Artist and piano faculty member at University of Mobile.

Our **June Luncheon Meeting** and officer elections will be held at the home of Martha Mayeu, in Gulfport, on Wednesday, June 14.
