



Dr. Susan A. Smith currently teaches voice, music theory, chamber choir, vocal jazz, and recital class at Jones College, and is the former Fine Arts Division Chair at Jones County Junior College. Prior to coming to Jones, Dr. Smith was the Director of Choral Activities at Tennessee Tech University in Cookeville, TN. While in Tennessee, she conducted and travelled internationally with her choral ensembles as well as The Tennessee Ambassadors. She has taught at both the high school and college levels in Florida, Tennessee, and Mississippi. She has degrees from The Florida State University in Vocal Performance, Music Theory, and Choral Music Education. Dr. Smith is active as a judge and clinician and has presented and/or published articles on vocal technique, sight singing, and the use of the *International Phonetic Alphabet* in the high school choral program. Dr. Smith received the Clayton Krehbiel conducting award while in Florida, and was chosen as a recipient of the *Lamplighters* award and received the Teacher of the Year award at JCJC. In addition to teaching responsibilities, Dr. Smith is a member of the American Choral Directors Association, the National Association of Teachers of Singing, and serves as Vocal Area Chair for Mississippi Music Teachers National Association.

#### Music Forum of Jackson

For Music Forum of Jackson, 2019 opened with a bang and feet on the floor! Our 50th Bach Festival was held again at Hinds Community College, with the able Kathie Lott in charge again. 394 students participated, with 49 teachers and 8 judges from all across the state participating. Twenty-five 5-year medals were awarded; sixty-nine students were also celebrated for achieving 6 to 9 years of Superiors. For students of MFJ members, six 5-year medalists were offered a partial scholarship to a Music Camp in Mississippi; five of these did accept and have registered for camps.

Jacquelyn Thornell chaired the MMTA pre-college evaluations again on April 13 at Belhaven University for the second year, thanks to the generosity of Dr. Stephen Sachs and the BU music faculty. This year 120 students (including twelve vocal students), some entering two categories, took part. More than sixty students were eligible to participate at State Finals at MUW on May 18. Fifteen 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> graders scored 270 and above, and forty-six students in levels 4-12 scored 360 or above.

MFJ celebrated the end of the year with our Spring Luncheon at Anjou Restaurant, organized by Social Chairperson Ruth Keyes. #### **Gulf Coast Music Teachers Association**

GCMTA's Music Festival was held on February 16, 2019, at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College's Jeff Davis Campus in Gulfport. Our Festival hosted 99 piano and strings performances, by 90 students, from the studios of 20 member and non-member teachers. Three Honors Recitals showcased 77 of these performances. Two students who have performed in the Festival Honors Recitals for at least 5 consecutive years were presented with Five-Year Awards of \$25 each. Judging for the event were Dr. Ellen Elder of University of Southern Mississippi; Jorge Gonzalez of William Carey University; Guy Bowering, Gulf Coast accompanist and teacher; and Yvonne Young-McGrath, Gulf Coast soloist and teacher. Bonnie Sheldon did an outstanding job as Festival Chair.

Our local MMTA Pre-college Evaluations took place on April 6, at MGCCC-JD. Participating were 52 piano and strings students representing seven teachers. These students turned in a total of 57 performances. Qualifying for State Finals were 29 students representing five teachers. Piano judges were Dr. Debra Atkinson, Dr. Michaelle Harrison, and Dr. Brian Murphy. Dr. Stephen Redfield served as strings adjudicator. Carol Mahler was assisted by Angela Hsu in chairing the Evaluations.

This year, one senior will perform in GCMTA's **Senior Awards Recital**, which will take place at Biloxi First United Methodist Church on Sunday afternoon, May 19. Dr. Joanna Burnside will adjudicate and make the scholarship award.

Our **June Salad Luncheon Meeting** and officer elections will be held at the home of Peggy Peterson, in Gautier, on Wednesday, June 12.
