Music Forum of Jackson

Music Forum hosted a coffee in September in the home of Kay Johnson for the purpose of inviting non-member teachers in the area to join our professional organization. We had one new member due to the event, with several more considering membership.

We look forward to a program in October on Your Favorite Teaching Pieces. Also, our new program chair, Dorothy Claire Glover, will report on her summer studies as the recipient of MFMC's Ouida Keck's award for study with a teacher specializing in the Taubman method and also MTNA's teacher enrichment award.

In November we hope to have record attendance at the state conference at MUW. November will also bring Sonatina/Sonata Festival, hosted by Millsaps College. Last year 16 teachers participated, with 60 students taking part. Of those, 15 gold medals were awarded, 22 silver, 21 honorable mention, and 2 excellents, to total 60 great awards.

2019 Conference, November 1—2, 2019 Mississippi University for Women, Columbus




MIDORI KOGA, Clinician

With performances described as "passionate" (*Ann Arbor News*), "meltingly lovely", "rippling clean" (*Globe and Mail*), and "with exquisite tone colors" (*Fanfare Magazine*), pianist Midori Koga has been featured as soloist and chamber musician throughout Canada, USA, Spain, Taiwan, China and Austria, including highlight appearances in New York's Merkin Hall, Ann Arbor's Hill Auditorium, and for the ProMozart Society of Detroit. Recently, Koga joined *Soundstreams Ensemble* as featured guests at the Shanghai Conservatory New Music Festival, and at Koerner Hall in Toronto, Canada. Internationally released recordings can be heard on the Albany, Equilibrium, Fleur de Son, NAXOS, Blue Griffin and Centrediscs labels.

The newly released CD *Bright Angel: Contemporary Works for clarinet and piano*, carried by the Fleur de Son label, was included on the long ballot Grammy nomination list, with performances described as "kraftvoll und glänzen durch hervorragende Motivarbeit" (vibrant, and shines through superb motivic work) by Naxos Deutschland. The disc recorded with mezzo-soprano Patricia Green entitled *Ice Age and Beyond: Works by Canadian Women Composers*, funded by a grant through the Canadian Music Centre, with distribution throughout the US (Albany) and Canada (CMC Distribution Inc.), was awarded a Four Star review by the BBC Music Magazine. In another Canadian project funded by the Ontario Arts Council, the recording *Glistening Pianos: Two Piano Works by Alice Ho* featuring the piano duo 2X10 with pianist Lydia Wong, received a JUNO nomination for recording in the Best Contemporary Work category. This collaborative project gave Koga the opportunity to work with famed producer David Jaeger formerly of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC).

Also active as lecturer, adjudicator and piano pedagogy specialist, Dr. Koga has served in the College of Examiners for the Royal Conservatory of Music, as national adjudicator for the Canadian Music Competitions, and has presented pedagogical workshops worldwide. Highlight presentations include those for the *International Society for Music Education Conference* in Bologna, Italy, Thessaloniki, Greece and Glasgow, Scotland; *Music Teachers' National Association Conferences* in Washington DC, Seattle WA, Toronto, ON, Orlando FL; the *World Piano Pedagogy Conference* in Atlanta; the *National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy* in Chicago; and the *European Piano Teachers Association* in Helsinki, Finland.

A passionate educator, Midori Koga, currently serves as Associate Dean, Graduate Education as well as Associate Professor at the University of Toronto where she teaches piano and directs the first Canadian Master of Music and Doctoral programs in the area of Piano Pedagogy and Performance. She holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Michigan.





Kevin Richmond, Associate Professor and Associate Director for Undergraduate Studies, coordinates class piano and class piano pedagogy at the University of Memphis. Dr. Richmond has presented workshops, lectures, and recitals on extended techniques at numerous local, state, national and international events: *Music Teachers National Association* conferences in Texas, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Illinois; the *European Piano Teachers Association* in Estonia, Portugal, and Slovenia; the *Western Australia Piano Teachers Association*; the *World Piano Conference* in Serbia and the *International Society for Music Education* in China. Most recently, Dr. Richmond completed a week-long residency of workshops, recitals and masterclasses at the University of Costa Rica on 100 Years of New Sounds—the Legacy of Cowell and Crumb. He was awarded Article of the Year in 2014 by the *Music Teachers National Association* (MTNA) for his *MTNA e-Journal* article on non-traditional notation and techniques.



YAKOV KASMAN and DINA KASMAN, GUEST ARTISTS

Yakov Kasman's debut in America in 1997 as Silver Medalist in the Tenth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in Fort Worth was the culmination of several competition triumphs and tours in Europe and the Middle East, including prizes at the 1991 Valentino Bucchi Competition in Rome, the 1991 London World Piano Competition, the 1992 Artur Rubinstein International Competition in Tel Aviv, and the 1995 International Prokofiev Piano Competition in St. Petersburg.

Since his American debut, he has given concerts in the United States, South America, Europe, Russia and Asia, including recitals in New York City, Boston, Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Cleveland, St Louis, Kansas-City, St. Paul, Atlanta, and Birmingham. He has appeared as soloist with more than seventy orchestras including the Buffalo, Oregon, Pacific, Syracuse, Memphis, Miami, Ft. Worth, Nashville and Alabama symphonies, Athens State Orchestra, the Orchestre de Lille and Orchestre Philharmonique de Montpellier in France, the Singapore Symphony, the National Symphony Orchestra of Taiwan, Orquestra Simfonica de Baleares (Spain), Daejeon Philharmonic Orchestra (South Korea) and the Moscow Philharmonia Orchestra.

Kasman has fifteen studio CD recordings on the Calliope label. His two CD set of the recordings of the complete sonatas of Prokofiev was awarded the "Grand Prix de la Nouvelle Academie du Disque" in France in 1996. Other CDs include solo works by Haydn, Scriabin, Stravinsky, and Rachmaninov. The International Piano Quarterly magazine recommended his CD of Moussorgsky's "Pictures at an Exhibition" as one of 14 equally ranked best in a survey of recordings over the past 75 years.

His recording of Shostakovich's Concerto No. 1, and Schnittke's Concerto for Piano and Strings, released in 2000, received the "Choc du monde de la musique" award in France, is rated highest for artistry and sound quality by ClassicsToday.com and referred to as "superlative" in the American Record Guide. He has also recorded two CDs with Harmonia Mundi, the most recent one with the Pacific Symphony includes Piano Concerto No. 2 by Lukas Foss, released in 2001. In 2003 he completed a recording of all of the Scriabin piano sonatas and in 2004 recorded an All-Tchaikovsky CD featuring "The Seasons" and Grand Sonata in G-Major (Rated 10/10 by ClassicsTodayFrance.com in December 2005). In 2007 he completed a four-CD set of the chamber music of Shostakovich with the Talich Quartet on the Calliope label.

Yakov Kasman is also active as a teacher and adjudicator. He was a jury member of the Busoni International Piano Competition (Bolzano), International Piano Competition in Memory of Vladimir Horowitz (Kiev), the Corpus Christi International Competition, "Merzlyakovka invites friends" All-Russian Piano Competition in Moscow, Kalinnikov International Piano Competition in Orel and for four years has judged the Rocky Mountain Amateur Piano Competition (Colorado Springs). He has been guest artist and faculty at the Piano Texas International Academy and Festival (Fort Worth), and for several years at the International Summer Music Academy in Kiev.

Born in the city of Orel, near Moscow, Yakov Kasman began his piano studies at the age of five. A graduate and postgraduate of the Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory and previously a professor of piano at the Music College of the Conservatory, he is now the Distinguished Professor of Piano and Artist-in-Residence at the University of Alabama, Birmingham. His students are winners of regional, national and international competitions.

Dina Kasman, 19, is from Birmingham, AL.

She is a winner of numerous local, state, and regional competitions, including multiple MTNA competitions in Alabama and an alternate winner of the MTNA Southern Division in 2013. Dina won II and I prize of two consecutive Alabama Symphony concerto competitions. She has participated in the Kiev International Music Academy in Ukraine in 2013, 2016, and 2018 performing as a soloist with the National Symphony of Ukraine.

Dina is actively involved in Alabama's musical and community life, playing piano recitals in Birmingham, Huntsville and Fairhope. This includes many charity events and working as a collaborative pianist with students as well as professional artists of high caliber.

In 2018, Dina became a winner of the Southern Adventist University Concerto Competition and took II place at the LaGrange Symphony Concerto Competition.

Dina recently entered the UAB Department of Music as well as the highly competitive University Honors Program. She studies with Yakov Kasman, distinguished professor of piano/artist-in-residence at UAB. In addition to music, Dina was a part of multiple theater productions at Vestavia Hills High School. In the 2017-18 school year, she won top acting awards at Alabama state theater competitions.

Dina is fluent in Russian and French and served as the president of the French Honors Society at VHHS.



JASON CARL ROSENBERG, Commissioned Composer

Jason Carl Rosenberg (b.1979; Ph.D. in Music from UC San Diego) is an acclaimed composer, conductor, and music cognition researcher. Having worked in Switzerland and Singapore for several years, Dr. Rosenberg is active in several contemporary music scenes in the U.S. and abroad, and seeks to link these communities through collaborative projects and innovative programming. His concert music uses contrapuntal inventiveness and rhythmic vitality to create rich environments of "power and persuasion...and violence" (Herald Tribune). His music also features an interaction with historical models, especially from the Renaissance and Baroque, through an idiosyncratic artistic practice based on evocation and transformation. Rosenberg has been a selected composer at several festivals, including the Royaumont Abbey and the Acanthes Festival, and has received the Salvatore Martirano Award and the Foro de Música Nueva Composition Prize. Dr. Rosenberg is currently an Assistant Professor and Director of Music Theory & Composition at Sewanee: The University of the South.
