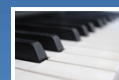
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Message from the President (continued)

We have also changed the date of the Collegiate Competitions to later in the Spring, with the hope of achieving greater participation. Treasurer's Report



At this point half way through the financial fiscal year the MMTA finances are in good shape. Due to the way covid-19 affected the running of the Fall Conference we had less expenses than we normally would. The income of the Fall Conference, including the MAC Grant, was \$6556.48 and the expenses were only \$3430.01. The MAC Grant we received allowed us to have a monetary gain from the conference, whereas if we had not received the grant, we would have actually had a loss. Thank you, Valentin, for your hard work in securing the MAC Grant.

I am glad to say that we have had \$335.00 donated to MMTA in honor of Dr. Harold Thompson, who passed away in 2020. He was a driving force for keeping MMTA active and progressive. I was privileged to have taken music theory classes as an undergraduate and graduate student from Dr. Thompson. He had a unique sense of humor and had a passion for music that was always evident in each class I took from him.

Overall, during the first six months of the current fiscal year, including the Fall Conference, we have \$8,921.48 in income with \$4092.01 in expenses. At the moment, even with the covid-19 disruptions, I believe the MMTA financial outlook for the next six months is positive.

Jones County Music Teachers Association will participate virtually in the Ellisville area MMTA Evaluations March 27, 2021.

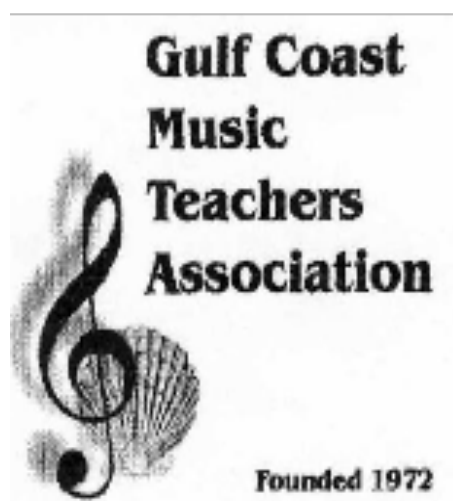
