Treasurer's Report



At this point in our current fiscal year, overall, we have had \$13,555.70 in income and \$15,067.61 in expenses for a net loss of \$1511.91. At the Fall Conference this past November we had \$9270.70 in income and \$14,542.62 in expenses for a net loss of \$5271.92.

Interestingly, the largest single expense category for the conference was \$4584.00 paid to the MTNA judges. That breaks down to \$3600.00 for the judging fee and \$984.00 for the judges' mileage expense. At the 2021 virtual Fall Conference the MTNA judges' expense was only \$2000.00, less than half the same expense incurred at the 2022 conference.

In 2021 there were 8 judges at \$250 each with no travel expense. In 2022 there were 9 judges at \$400.00 each plus mileage costs. However, in 2021 there were 38 student entries and in 2022 there were 33 entrants. So the expense in 2022 was more than double that of 2021 even though there were 5 less student entrants. I realize that the 2021 conference was virtual and the 2022 conference was in person, but I suggest that we engage fewer MTNA judges for the 2023 Conference if possible.

Even though we currently have a \$1511.91 net loss for the fiscal year, the Pre-College Evaluations and Finals are coming up and we usually have a net gain for these events. Hopefully this will happen and we will end the year on the upside. As always, if you need any help from me concerning MMTA finances do not hesitate to reach out.

A business meeting was held prior to the above event.


